# <u>OBE</u>

- For the purpose of Outcome Based Education Indirect assessment, survey from students on the Program Outcomes (PO) and Course Outcomes (CO) is required. In this regard, departments are asked to give their POs and COs as stated below:
  - 1. POs for present III Years (2020-2023 Batch) Questions for PO attainment computation one question per PO
  - 2. COs for Core, Allied and Practical papers for which COs are to be framed for present I & II years II semester papers of I Year (2022-2025 Batch) and IV semester papers of II Year (2021-2024 Batch) For each course, the questions to be based on the COs one question per CO. Each student will have to give feedback for each course with the number of questions = no. of COs

# **Blended mode of learning**

- Blended mode of teaching learning shall be implemented from the academic year 2023-2024 In a week (6 day orders), one day will be allotted for blended mode of teaching learning through online mode. Foundation courses will be 100% online. On the day allotted for online class, two hours are to be allotted for Foundation courses/ information security/ cyber security. The remaining three hours will be allotted for Language, core and allied courses.
- For foundation courses, online assessment of the students to be done after each hour.
- The blended learning contents for foundation courses are to be prepared by faculty members as assigned below.

# **Board of Studies**

- Board of Studies for the odd semester of the academic year 2024-2025 should be conducted in the fourth week of March or first week of April, with the existing board members
- The Board of Studies meeting should be conducted in physical mode. The members who cannot be physically present can join online.
- All Departments should get the Minutes of the BoS meetings checked by Dr. A. Shamitha Begum, Dean Academics, and signed by the Principal. Soft copy of the minutes should be sent to Dean Academics.
- If there are any changes suggested by the alumni, the name of the alumni should be mentioned in the tabular column in the minutes
- Coursera licenses will be available on rotations basis for all three years of UG
- For I UG, along with the two mandated online courses, one coursera course of 30 hours should be added. Hence total credits for online courses is 3
- Course coordinators to help the students to select the course
- For II UG, Generative AI (Gen AI) course is mandatory. Students will be able to take this course based on the coursera rotation and lab availability
- For III UG one course from Coursera and one SBS course offered by the department to be taken.

## Or

Two SBS courses offered by the department. In this case, the students can do coursera courses outside the curriculum

• While submitting the minutes, for UG Board, the following statement should be mentioned along with the tabular column.

"All the existing Skill Based Courses offered by various departments and the newly introduced Skill Based courses like Drone Technology, Gen AI courses and Coursera courses (45 hrs) are pooled together in the Skill Hub. UG students of all programmes are free to select four SBS courses from this skill hub".

- In the minutes tabular column, for II UG the Skill Based Course should be mentioned as GenAI/Coursera and for III UG- Coursera/ SBS.
- After completion of the BoS procedures, Departments should submit a list of five subject experts affiliated to Bharathiar University for the next year's board to Dean Academics.

## **E-Content:**

- E-contents for the first-year foundation courses are ready. The E-contents must be stored in a common folder. Faculty in-charges can download the videos from the shared folder and make it available to the students.
- The faculty members shall discuss the preparation of E-contents for one core course for III UG. All the interested faculty members shall be involved in preparing the course content.

#### **Faculty Development Programme**

IQAC has planned to organize a Faculty Development Programme on "Empowering Academicians: AI Powered Research for Excellence", to focus on enhancing the research capabilities of academicians by delving into key aspects such as Research and Reference Management, Research Integrity, and Writing Assistance. IQAC has also planned to organize a Faculty Development Programme on Stress Management. Selected faculty members from all departments were solicited to attend the FDP.



#### MINUTES OF THE IQAC GENERAL BODY MEETING

#### Time: 11:00 am

#### **Venue: Conference Hall**

The IQAC general body meeting was convened on 05.04.2024. Chairperson Dr. Nandini welcomed the external members who graciously spared their valuable time to share their expertise with us. She welcomed the internal members of the IQAC and appreciated them for working together with the collective vision of maintaining KCW as a premier institute of higher education at the national level. In her introductory note Chairperson highlighted the accolades of the college, recognition as College of Excellence, accreditation by NAAC with 'A+++' Grade, and ranked 4<sup>th</sup> in NIRF. The Chairperson stated that we highly value the suggestions of the external members and will work upon their suggestions to upgrade the college to a greater status.

The IQAC Coordinator Dr.J. Balavijayalakshmi, Associate Professor and Head of the Department of Physics, gave a brief presentation on the significant achievements of the college and highlighted recent accolades such as grants of DST FIST PG Level A, DST CURIE PG and Skill Satellite Centre-DSIR. She gave a brief overview of the enriched curriculum, teaching learning practices, academic performance of the students, their placement and upward mobility, and community connect through social immersion programmes aligned with UN SDGs. She elaborated about the centres of excellence that have been established in the college, especially, "The Centre of Excellence for Apparel Made-ups and Home Furnishing", which was established with a grant of 1.5 crore from the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Govt of India on 9 March 2024. She pointed out the objectives of the other Centres of Excellence functioning effectively in KCW such as the Nodal Training Institute under the Agri-Clinics and Agri-Business Centres (ACABC) Programme, BIRAC E-YUVA Centre, Centre of Excellence for Commerce Professionals, Centre of Excellence in Life Sciences, GRG ELGi Digital Innovation Dojo and CIIED. In commemoration of the birth centenary of our founder Smt.G.Chandrakanthi Amma the following centres were established on 19 January 2024: Chandrakanthi Centre for

Women Leadership, Centre for Advanced Materials and Sustainable Technologies and GRG Incubator. These centres facilitate, nurture and encourage research, innovation, start-ups and entrepreneurial ventures.

The IQAC coordinator spoke about the vibrant research ecosystem in the college. This academic year, projects have been sanctioned by various government funding agencies to the tune of Rs.499.91 lakh. The management has contributed 106.34 lakh over the past five years for funding GRG Trust projects to promote active research acumen among the faculty. She also spoke about the global partnership ventures undertaken by the college and the MoUs signed with Universities abroad over the past years. She explained the functioning of the Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship (CIIED) and GRG GEN NXT, a Section 8 Company started by GRG Trust this year to focus on IT, Bio & Food Tech businesses. National level recognition bagged by NCC Cadets and NSS volunteers and international and national medals won by Sports students were highlighted. She also explained about the institutional development plan to be implemented in the future and requested the members to give their suggestions to further promote the standard of the college.

The external members appreciated the IQAC of KCW for the proactive stance and consistence in working towards enhancement of the standard of the college. Dr. M. Balasubramaniam, Professor, Department of Physics, Bharathiar University, Coimbatore, graced the meeting with his presence. Dr. Mary Sajini Devadas, Associate Professor, Department of Chemistry, Towson University, Maryland, USA, Mr. Shiv Shankar Sharma, Facilitator- Education Post, Director-IIRF World University Ranking 2026, Convener-IIRF Education Impact Awards, Secretary General-Federation for World Academics (FWA), Partner-Accre NAAC and Dr. Sunita Sharma Deputy Director – IQAC. Pro VC Office, Associate Professor – ASLA Amity University, Haryana, joined the meeting online.

#### Suggestions given by the External Members

#### **Dr.Shiv Shankar Sharma**

Dr Shiv Shankar Sharma said that KCW is a well known brand and appreciated the good ranking of the college. He also appreciated the infrastructure of the college and insisted that the academic reputation should be maintained. Further he requested the college to focus on the following aspects:

- ✓ To integrate Professional Practice
- $\checkmark$  To focus upon sustainable education

## **Dr.Mary Sajini Devadas**

She raised a query about the collaborative initiatives taken by the college with Universities abroad. Professor Balasubramaniam explained the functioning of the Office of International Affairs in detail and highlighted about the Summer Immersion Programmed, COIL - Collaborative online teaching and faculty exchange programme undertaken.

Dr.Mary Sajini Devadas also suggested that the college should encourage the students to apply for International Fellowships such as Rhodes Scholarship, Manmohan Singh Scholarship and QUAD Scholarship.

Principal Dr.P.Meena gave the concluding remarks of the meeting. She thanked the management for their consistent support and encouragement given for all initiatives. She said that implementation of NEP will happen in accordance with the state government's education policy. She explained about the social immersion programmes conducted in alignment with SDGs under our flagship programme 'Virutcham'. She explained that there are various clubs undertaking community oriented activities. Students have to enroll in any one of the clubs and they are evaluated based on their involvement in such activities. She assured the members that their valuable suggestions will be implemented and thanked them for helping us to focus our trajectory in the right direction to keep flying higher.
